dear frends John And hana bound {Bowne} Mary [....] Sam: & hestar Spicer1 dear frends My love in ye lord Reacheth to you all who hath loved us in Christ Jesus And hath quickened us and Raised us from death to life and douth Atone us by his presious Life y<sup>t</sup> wee may grow And Inward dayly in y<sup>e</sup> same over death & darkness And ye workes thearof And soo be witneses for ye lord in his patience And Righteous life in ye world Amongst A Crooked parvarse generation I say in this love douth my soule Reach to you And in it doe I salute you And shall be glad as ye lord Makes way for Mee to see you that wee may be Refreshed And Cumforted in ye lord who in this day of his grat love to all The faithfull inharite & becume as a place of broad Rivers the streames whearof Reines & Refreshes our harts: strengthens And Makes bould for his Nam And truth And beare up our heads in all our Afliktions And Conducts us in our travell And pilgrimage in this world and brings us nearar & near to Acquaintance with him selfe in whose presence thear is Life: whoo is our only Joy And glorying to whom be glory And honour for Ever Amen—I have by Lidea wright<sup>2</sup> sent an Episell {Epistle} to be Read in yor meeting amongst frends who [....] har Cuming {her coming} in [MS torn] those parts of ye world hath behaved harselfe as becumes the gospell & frends I underst[] comforted In har and shee hath bene of good servis in her travels: truth prospers In this Cuntry although satan workes to hinder for A particular Account of Matere I Refer you to Lidia when shee Cumes by whom I send this I Am not Clear of this Cuntry as yet In ye Lords time I hop to see you who Am yor faithfull frend And brother in ye testemony of joyous [MS torn] Tho Evernden<sup>3</sup>

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Sam: & hestar Spicer: Samuel (c. 1627-1700) and Hester (Esther) Tilton Spicer (1647-1703) of Gravesend and Oyster Bay, Long Island. Samuel was jailed for harboring New Netherland's first Quakers. Their burial place is Old Newton Friends Burial Ground, NJ.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Lidia Wright: (1655-1713) was the youngest of the three activist Wright sisters of Oyster Bay. She married Isaac Horner (1648-1708) in March 1684 indicating that she carried this sermon before that date.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Tho Evernden: Thomas Evernden (1629-1710) prominent Maryland Quaker active in the Third Haven Monthly Meeting was born in Canterbury, England and died in Maryland in 1710.
